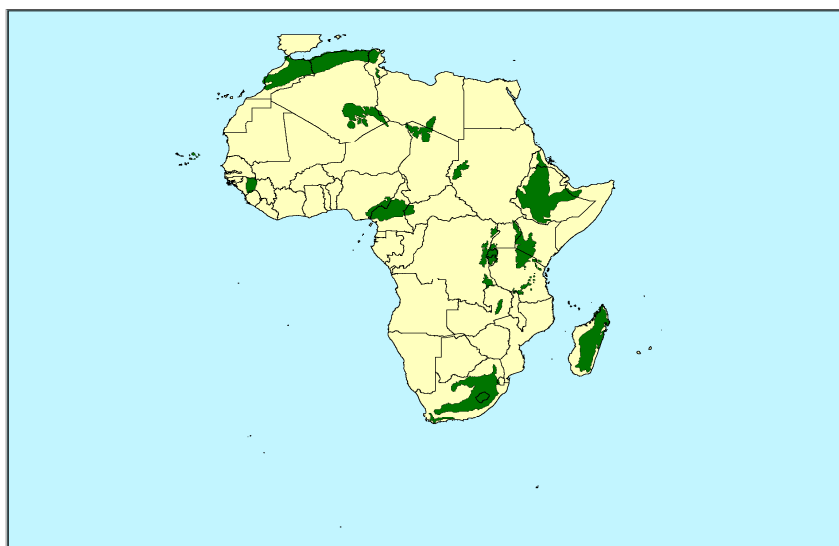

2. INTRODUCTION

Within the framework of the collaboration between the Mountain Partnership and the Mountain Forum a stocktaking exercise has been carried out in the period 2007- 2008 by the African Mountain Forum (AMF) and the Mountain Forum Secretariat (MFS).

The objective of this exercise was as indicated below:

‘ Undertake a stock taking exercise to determine who are the major actors in mountain development in Africa (in particular NGOs and civil society groups) and the nature of their mountain activities, tools developed and how they can benefit the wider mountain partnership community. This will support the further development of new activities and build on existing ones in the context of the East Africa Initiative of the Mountain Partnership.’

This report gives the background for the exercise; it outlines the process and activities undertaken and specifies the results.

During the breakaway session of the Mountain Partnership Second Global Meeting (Peru, Oct 2004), members of the East Africa Initiative met and identified priority areas that needed urgent action. The highest priority was to undertake an inventory to establish who is who and what has been done with regard to mountain issues so that all subsequent work is based on this information. Due to several reasons such as lack of funding and restructuring of the AMF, the effort could not be undertaken directly but was taken into the tasks to be implemented under the umbrella of the LoA for the support of the Mountain Partnership by the Mountain Forum.

The African Mountain Forum (AMF) is a network of organisations and individuals that have a keen interest in sustainable mountain development in the African region. AMF is supported by the Global Mountain programme (GMP) of CIP and hosted by ICRAF- the World Agro-Forestry Centre in Nairobi. Its activities are supervised by both the African Highlands Initiative in Uganda and the GMP.

The major objective of the Forum is to offer to members and the general public an unique opportunity to share information and lessons from the field, and bring them into policy discussions at national and international levels. The specific objectives of the African Mountain Forum are:

- (i) to contribute to sustainable development and conservation of mountain areas in Africa;
- (ii) to promote partnership and cooperation among communities and other stakeholders for sustainable mountain development in Africa.
- (iii) to establish a framework for information exchange on mountain issues, develop partnership on mountain interests and conduct advocacy and awareness raising work on mountain issues

This exercise was carried out by the AMF, who started the activity, together with the Mountain Forum Secretariat which has continued and finalized the Stocktaking exercise as the AMF is undergoing reorganisations. Also MFS integrated the acquired data into the Who=Who exercise. The MFS carries out critical functions to stimulate, catalyse and backstop where necessary, the activities of the Global Mountain Forum Network.

3. RATIONAL FOR A FOCUS ON HIGHLANDS AND MOUNTAINS IN AFRICA

The African highlands and mountain ranges fulfil key functions for sustainable development, especially for the livelihoods of large numbers of people and natural resources. The following 16 main highlands and mountain ranges can be found. Their location is indicated in the map and table below.

Despite their importance for livelihoods of large populations in Africa via livestock and agricultural systems, and their key role for essential environmental services water, the African highlands and mountains ranges are marginalized. Whereas food security and economic growth receive consistent broad attention, environmental degradation and sustaining environmental services stays in the background. The focus on increasing agricultural outputs is often at the expense of the sustainability of important agro-ecosystems.

Driving forces are increases in human population levels, limited policies and institutional strategies, and restricted livelihood options. These conditions increase unsustainable agricultural intensification through expansion into marginal lands as hillsides and mountain ranges. Additional forces are increasing competition for and conflict over water, grazing and forest resources, eroding biodiversity assets, and socio- and policy environments that discourage necessary investments to maintain or replenish natural resources. In addition "new generation" challenges emerge. Climate change brings dynamic changes to farming systems, influences patterns of diversification and intensification, and to the resources themselves, the most serious being water shortages.

However they face major threats and challenges (*based on AHI ref. www.africanhighlands.org/challenges.html*):

Agriculture-based livelihoods:

- Unsustainable agriculture systems through small land holdings with high fragmentation and unstable tenancy regimes;
- Intensive soil and water losses and associated off-site effects, limited investments in conservation measures and maintenance of land cover;
- Nutrient depletion of soils coupled with the inability to replenish nutrients;
- Increases in pests and diseases associated with declining soil health and productivity, affecting major cash and food crops;

Biodiversity

- Reduction of biodiversity through the destruction of habitats for wild species due to encroachment on wetlands forested and protected areas, by burning and elimination of micro-habitats within agricultural lands.
- Depletion of highland forest ecosystems and tree biodiversity in farm-based agroforestry systems, community forests, and natural forests coupled with weak protection and land tenure policies;

Water resources

- scarcity and inefficient use of water for agriculture, livestock and other competing uses within the mountains and along mountain to lowland gradients; mountains function as water towers and source of major rivers and watersheds

Conflicts and generally adverse processes

- Declining ability of livestock to maintain land-use systems by poorly intensified feeding systems, poor links to markets and break down of traditional management systems. Decline of grazing lands leads to an increased number of conflicts;
- Poor public services and infrastructure seriously limiting access to credit and markets.

- Increased marginalization and exacerbating poverty. The situation is worsened by the increase in HIV and the increased need for family labour to seek employment elsewhere.

One of the key areas of SMD efforts is East and Central Africa. Here, large numbers of people and governments depend on the produce and exports from the intensively cultivated highlands. They constitute about 23% of the total landmass in the region, yet house over 50% of the population given their suitability for human habitation. Population densities (100-200 people per km²) are high, and have risen over the last fifty years, causing even further fragmentation of small farms. The negative interplay of population increase, limited livelihood options and non-supportive policies further threatens the resource base by erosion and deforestation with major effects also for the water supply in the region.

The sustainable mountain agenda is wide and its promotion and implementation requires involvement of a wide range of stakeholders, including research and development organizations, government agencies and civil society organisations at international, regional, national and local level. In particular NGOs and civil society organisations can play a key role in raising awareness, identifying options and solutions and supporting local communities with implementation of SMD activities.

Several key organizations in Africa are involved in sustainable development of the highland mountain regions of Africa including well-known international research and development organizations as ICRAF and GMP. However for the proper implementation of activities and support of initiatives such as that of the Mountain partnership a more thorough stocktaking exercise was required. A stock taking exercise of 'who is doing what, how, where and with whom?' is the base for forging possible linkages between key stakeholders especially civil society organisation is necessary since the global mountain landscape is wider than Mountain Forum and the Mountain Partnership and partners only.

4. METHODOLOGY USED

a. Parameters definition and tool for Data collection

A data collection form has been designed to collect information about the mountain focused stakeholders in Africa. (See Annex ii).

This includes descriptive data about the organisation, the contact as well as the thematic focus according to the 4 main headings of NRM, Climate Change, Livelihoods and cross-cutting issues, with specification sub-categories.

In addition, the exercise focuses on information about organisations whose focus is not limited to highlands and mountain ranges but working on themes that are relevant for sustainable mountain development or have wider development objectives and work in highlands and mountain regions. Civil society organisations that act as bridge between research, development and policymakers are particularly relevant.

b. Data collection and storage

Various major institution databases were used to identify the key actors in mountain development activities in Africa. These included the expert database of MRI, the organisational database of InfoBridge, MRD and more. Also use was made of inputs from the Board and ICRAF/AHI and GMP. This was completed by Internet research of institutions on key stakeholders.

Whereas this activity was intended to focus mainly on Central-East Africa it has been expanded to cover all relevant institutions in the African region.

All data of the Africa Stock taking database was merged with the “Who is Who” information, for which the MFS has developed an enhanced on-line search and retrieval system. All information regarding African Institutions working with Mountain interest can be searched www.mtnforum.org/wisw/index.php.

A complete list of gathered information is compiled and attached below annex 2. This is also available in the on-line database which serves as a repository and point of reference and can be updated.

5. SUMMARY OF RESULTS

The information gathered by the Secretariat of Mountain Forum for the “who is Who” and the Africa Stock taking exercise leads to below summary of the results:

a. Number of Organizations gathered

Overall information on 102 organizations was gathered as of July 1, 2008. Below is a tabular figure of number of organizations categorized by countries of Africa:

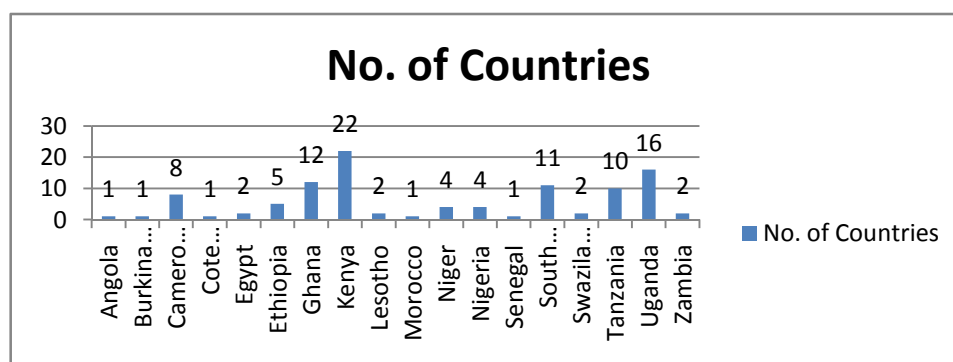


Chart 1: Number of organizations by country

It may be noted that there is a big concentration of organizations with mountain interest around East and Central Africa. Countries like: Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania having the largest number.

However countries like Ghana in West Africa, and South Africa also have with a considerable number of organizations with Mountain interest. The scarcity of Mountain interest organizations in other countries proves there is a lot to be done to increase interest to mountains.

b. Categories of organizations

The chart and table below shows clearly that spread of mountain interested organizations are various stakeholder categories, including private sectors, civil societies to government and non government organizations.

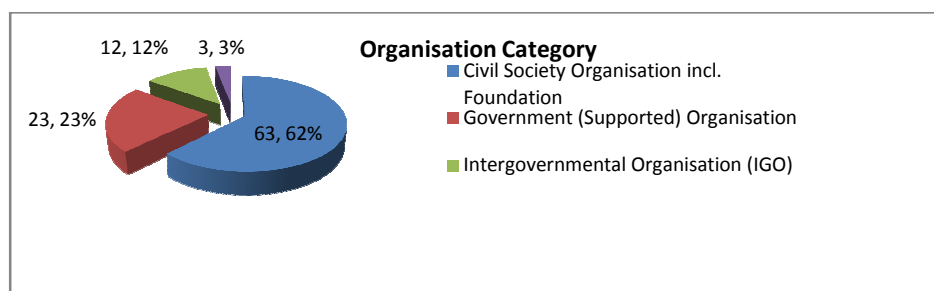


Chart 2: Percentage of Categories of organizations

It can be noted that a large number of civil society organizations are interested in the Mountain regions, but only a minimal number of private sector organizations. Although governmental and intergovernmental organizations are present in the overview, efforts must be done to further complete the picture.

c. Thematic Clusters

The table below shows the thematic focus of the various stakeholders in mountain regions of the African Continent.

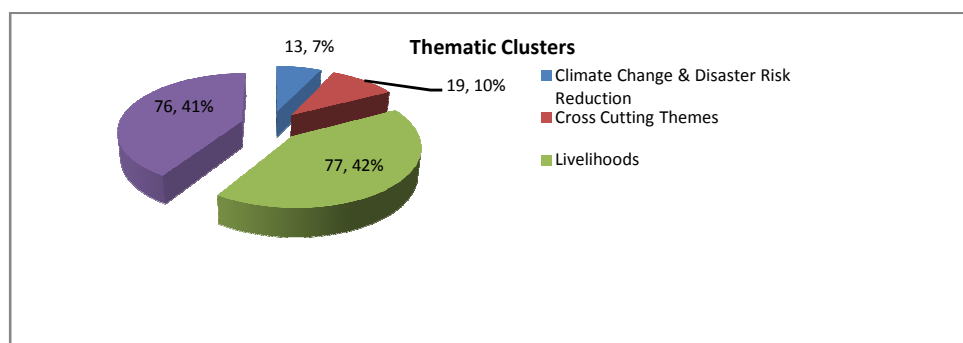


Chart 3: Percentage by Thematic clusters

The data shows ample focus on Livelihoods and Natural Resource Management in the mountain region in Africa. However more effort should be done to capture information about organisations working on Climate Change and cross cutting themes as conflict resolution.

Below a tabular data showing the type of work done by the governmental, intergovernmental organizations, Civil Society Organizations as well as private sectors

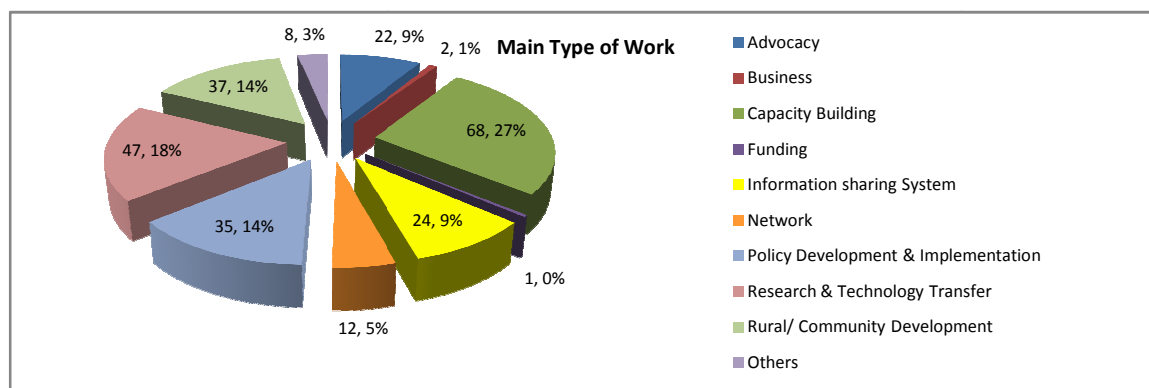


Chart 4: Percentage of Organisations engaged in different type of works

Considering majors issues around African Mountain regions lots of effort must be done to enhance the value of Private Sectors involvement in the sustainable development of Mountain regions. Only 2 Private sectors are involved in Sustainable development in the African mountain region, whereas the largest numbers of organisations (68) are doing capacity building work. Much effort should be done to increase networking among Mountain interested organisations, same goes with the Information sharing, Funding activities and Advocacy.

6. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

a. Conclusions

The African stock-taking exercised has identified the main players especially civil society organisations as well as the thematic focus and concentration of stakeholders in the sustainable mountain development landscape in Africa.

Linking the outputs of the “Africa stock taking” exercise to the “Who is Who” exercise with the on-line tools provides structured and targeted information. The collected information can be beneficial and serve as tool to:

- a) help increase awareness of “who is doing what in Africa’
- b) identify areas of collaboration between African stakeholders by the Mountain Partnership and support the operations of the African Mountain Forum
- c) identify African mountain regions and SMD themes that need attention
- d) enhance profiles as well as capacity of organisations on major thematic areas of SMD

The joint MF and MPS exercise has provided a basic platform with information on the African SMD landscape through this mapping exercise. This can help to reduce overlap amongst organisations, foster synergies where complementarities are required and help identifying priorities for research and development activities on sustainable development of the highlands and mountain ranges in Africa. The stocktaking exercise is a good example of collaboration between the Mountain Forum and the Mountain Partnership Secretariat for mutual benefit.

b. Recommendations

Despite the achievements so far, it is clear that extra efforts are required to enhance the information content, both widening and deepening it. Activities are recommended to allow for decentralised management of the “who is who” platform so the concerned organizations modify their own profiles, which will help updating own information for sharing with other organisations.

In addition, more efforts are required to forge linkages between the players within the SMD framework and connect scattered SMD relevant organisations.

This document could be relevant for funding agencies at global, regional and national level since the mapping exercise identifies areas for potential support and development activities.
