
Select a site

an area with mosaic of landuse and community interactions

Pre-Journey phase

Build a multidisciplinary team

involve stakeholders with diverse interests and expertise including community representtives



make it a low key, informal event using as much local resources as possible; plan out journey routes and logistic needs







The Journey phase I

Have a debriefing session each day

Share your observation and ideas and listen to others' perspectives

Investigate issues of societal relevance

Identify research questions, management opportunities, and policy issues aligning with the community vision; Use "Appreciative Inquiry" approach

Know your teammates and the roles

Prepare yourself and the team to observe, interact, share, and connect with the landscape elements; give joint orientation









The Journey phase II

Develop a shared vision

Collectively picture the future (vision) for the landscape and identify interfaces for science-practicepolicy connect

Identify needed interventions

Identify disciplinary interventions including support functions to strengthen capacity of community institutions

Identify feedback machanism

Prepare a timeline to consolidate the journey information and share with the landscape communities and wider audience
