

Strengthening Water Resources Management in Afghanistan (SWaRMA) is a two-year project supported by the governments of Afghanistan and Australia, and implemented by the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) and Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) with government organizations, academia, and national partners to improve water resources management in Afghanistan.

SWaRMA has identified seven thematic areas relevant to enhancing capacity, co-creating knowledge, and facilitating co-learning platforms:




Water availability analysis


Co-create knowledge on water resources assessment in the Kabul river basin using hydrological models

Capacity enhancement on basin-level planning for decision making in complex time consuming and data limited environment

Strengthen networks/platforms to improve participation and engage Afghan stakeholders at regional-level fora and interactions
