Nyima Tashi has a Ph.D. in Physical Geography obtained from the Chinese Academy of Sciences. He headed the Department of Crop Breeding of the Tibet Agricultural Research Institute and, as a barley breeder, he developed several new barley varieties jointly with other breeders. He was the Director of the International Collaboration and Training Centre of the Tibet Academy for Agricultural and Animal Husbandry Sciences and managed several international collaborative projects on natural resource management and institutional capacity building in Tibet. He is a national member of the China Association for Sciences and Technology and has received several awards, e.g. Outstanding Worker of the Nation, from the Central Government of China. Currently he is a researcher and project coordinator working on mountain agricultural systems from an ecoregional perspective at the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) based in Kathmandu, Nepal.

Liu Yanhua is the Vice Minister of the Ministry of Sciences and Technology, The People's Republic of China. He has a Ph.D. in Physical Geography from the Chinese Academy of Sciences. He is a professor and doctoral research supervisor in the Institute of Geographical Sciences and Natural Resource Research of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, where he is supervising several doctoral candidates from both inland China and the Tibet Autonomous Region. Prior to this, he was the Director General of the Institute of Geography of the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the Director General of the Department of Rural and Social Development of the Ministry of Sciences and Technology, the People's Republic of China.

Tej Partap is the Vice Chancellor of CSK Palampur Agricultural University, Himachal Pradesh, India. He has a doctoral degree in Agroecology and has 25 years of experience in the fields of agricultural development and natural resource management on marginal/degraded lands, particularly mountain ecosystems. He headed the Mountain Farming Systems' Division at ICIMOD for seven years out of the thirteen years he served the Centre. He is an Hon. Professor of Mountain Agriculture at the Tibet Academy of Agriculture and Animal Sciences, Lhasa, where he has been an advisor on research planning and human resource development for highland agriculture since 1995, and Hon. Professor of Mountain Agriculture at the Institute of Geographical Science and Natural Resource Research, Chinese Academy of Sciences, Beijing. He has been an active promoter of cooperation and exchange of knowledge and information between the mountain regions of the world, and in 2000 he was elected as the representative for the Asia Pacific Mountain Network on the Board of Directors of the Mountain Forum.
