Pradeep Man Tulachan

Pradeep Man Tulachan has a BSc (Hons) in Agriculture from Haryana Agricultural University, Hissar, India, an MSc from the University of Illinois, USA, and a PhD in Agricultural Economy from Cornell University, USA. He began his career as a Lecturer at the Institute of Agriculture and Animal Science, Rampur, Nepal, worked in Papua New Guinea as a Senior Farming System Economist, and then for the US Agency for International Development (USAID) as a Senior Project Manager and Agricultural Economist. Mohamed Saleem is an environmental agronomist with 30 years of experience in Africa. After obtaining his PhD at the University of Ibadan, Nigeria, he became a Senior Lecturer at the same University. From 1980, he was an agronomist with the International Livestock Centre for Africa (ILCA) at its sub-humid site in Kaduna, Nigeria, until his transfer to ILCA HQ, now re-designated as the International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI), in 1995. Since 1989, he has led ILRI's Highlands/Mountain Research Team in Addis Ababa. At ILCA he was also serving as the Thrust Coordinator for Feed and Natural Resources' improvement from 1991 to 1995. Most of Mohamed Saleem's research career has been in Africa, and his principal interest is in improving livestock feed resources at different levels of land-use intensification, and developing strategies for efficient on/off farm resource use and conservation to improve human and environmental health. Mohamed Saleem has authored about 130 scientific papers.
