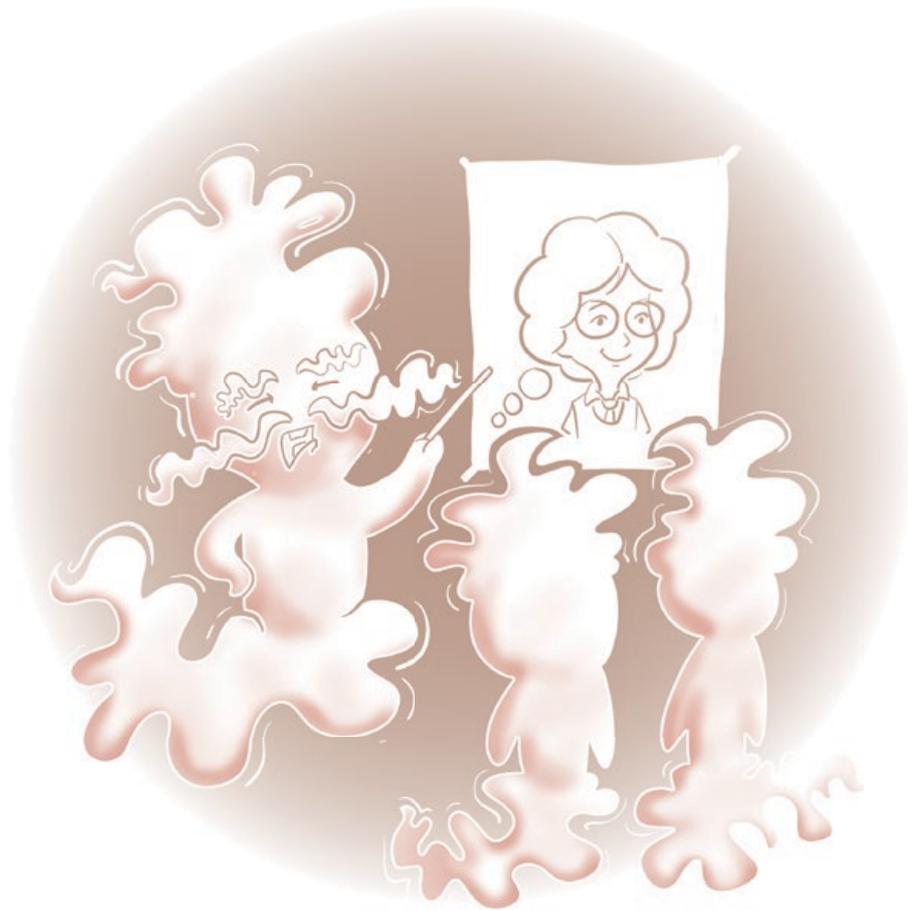

Bodhini and her mother entered a café. The café was filled with smoke.



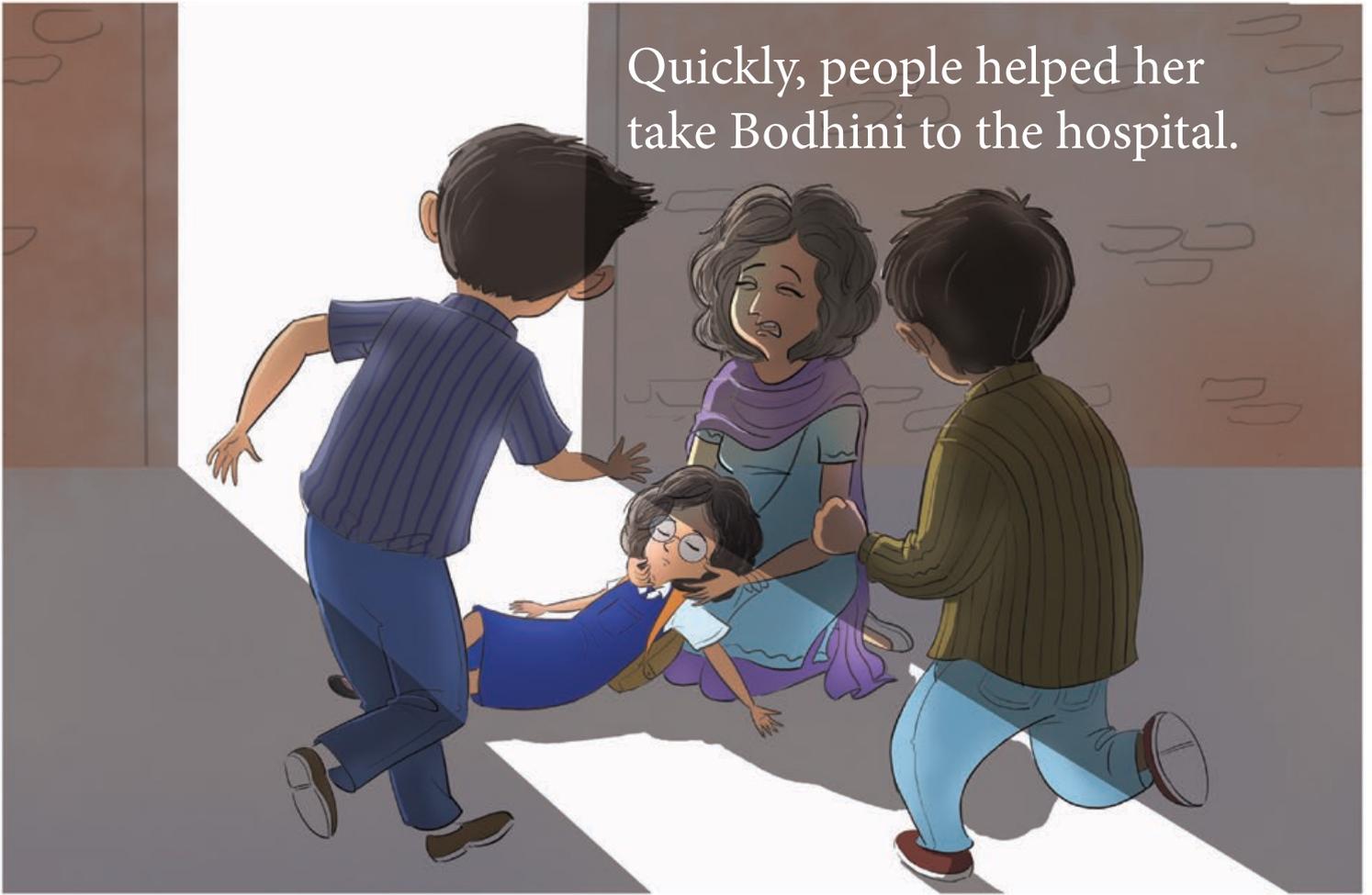
Bodhini's eyes burned. It was difficult for her to breathe. She began to cough.
