Cultural ecosystem services in the landscape

The Kailash Sacred Landscape is a 31,000 sq. km area that stretches across parts of China, India, and Nepal. It is rich in cultural ecosystem services. From the sacred Mount Kailash and Lake Manasarovar to vital rivers, immense biodiversity, and rich cultural heritage, people separated by borders are united by the landscape.

iHeritage is a citizen science app developed by the Kailash Sacred Landscape Conservation and Development Initiative (KSLCDI). It engages community members to map their cultural heritage in the transboundary landscape.

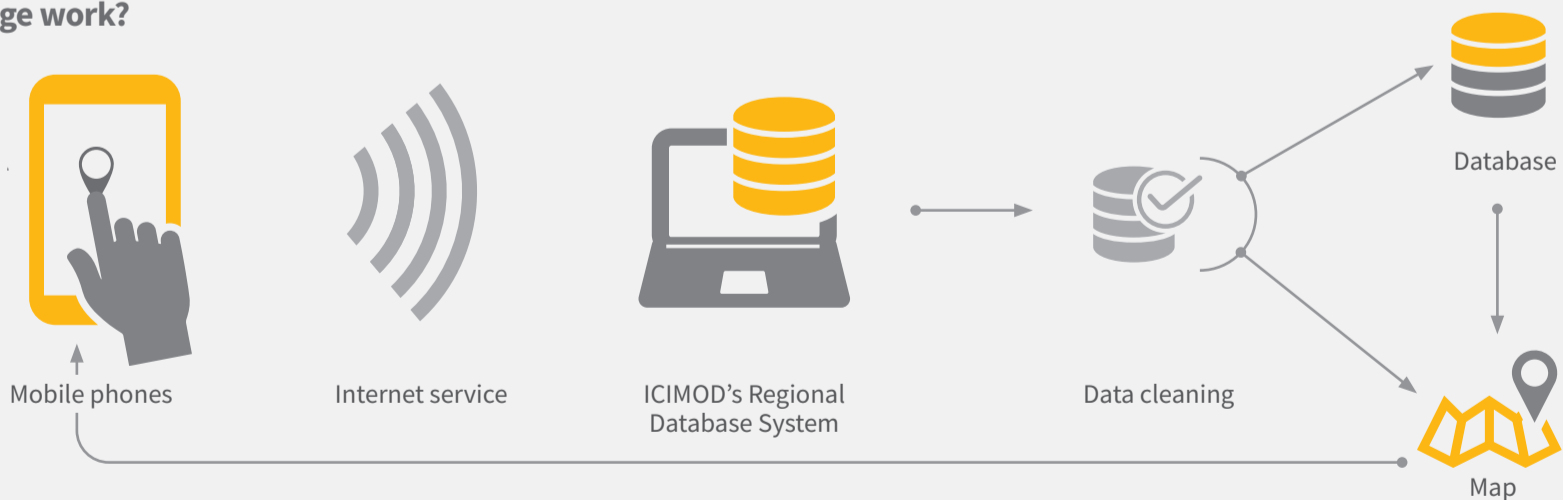
